About the Program

Today’s children are exhibiting more and more special learning needs that require teachers to work with them in new ways. Teachers are searching for appropriate educational approaches to support these students. The Remedial Education Program offers practicing Waldorf teachers and those in related fields the opportunity to deepen their knowledge and gain new skills in order to further their work.

This three-year part-time certificate program includes a two-week summer session and a four-day seminar in the fall and spring of each year. Each session includes theory and practical activities. Between sessions, students have reading, research, movement, painting, form drawing and observation assignments. The second and third years include work with a mentor and children.

The Extra Lesson approach to learning difficulties is the focus of this program. Other approaches are also explored along with neuropsychological and anthroposophical paradigms. Opportunities for teachers to deepen their faculties of perception include speech, eurythmy, Spatial Dynamics®, and the arts.
